### Thank you KDH Emergency Room Team



When Christa Mesman and her Dad Tom brought her Mom into the KDH Emergency room mid-summer 2018, she never thought she would end up as a patient.

While Ardele, her mother, was being treated in the ER, Christa suddenly developed a headache. Within a short period of time, the pain was shooting down her neck.

Emergency Room Doctor, Shawn Michael O'Donnell, who was treating Christa's Mom was so concerned by Christa's symptoms that he admitted her to the ER as well. After several hours of treatment, Christa's condition was not improving.

Dr. O'Donnell called the Ottawa Hospital to arrange for an emergency CT scan for Christa.

Upon arrival at the Civic Campus of the Ottawa Hospital, Christa was immediately taken for the CT scan. Results showed that she was suffering from a subarachnoid hemorrhage. (SAH) SAH is bleeding between the skull and the brain caused by an aneurism.

Christa spent the next 7 days in the Neurological Intensive Care Unit and a week on the Neurological Unit at the Civic. She feels extremely lucky to be alive. "If I had been at home, I probably would have assumed it was a migraine and gone to bed".

Christa and her Dad credit her survival to the swift actions of Dr. O'Donnell. 'Not only was I at the right place at the right time, but the fact that the Civic was prepared and waiting for my arrival made all the difference'.

Christa returned to work last January 2019 on a modified work schedule at St. Mark High School. Her recovery continues and she is thankful for the professional and compassionate emergency room staff at the Kemptville District Hospital.

#### New Mental Health Services for Children & Youth in North Grenville

It was just over two years ago when Frank Vassallo, CEO of Kemptville District Hospital (KDH) met with Lorena Crosbie, ED of Children's Mental Health of Leeds and Grenville to talk about the urgent need for more mental health services for children and youth in our community.

From that discussion, The Mental Health and Addictions Health Hub was born representing close to 20 agencies throughout North Grenville currently providing services to children and youth.



Joanne Desormeaux, Project Lead says the Hub has met several important milestones since its inception. For example there is a weekly walk in clinic for youth in Kemptville and a new Navigator position that helps connect youth to the right services in the community. The Navigator also provides crucial support to youth while waiting to access those services.

"We have asked the youth in our community to help us name the new Hub and we will be rolling out a communication strategy shortly including the introduction of social media platforms to increase awareness of Hub services in the community." says Desormeaux.

"Thanks to the Foundation who have been fundraising in support of the Hub over the past year, we will be able to move on a number of priority initiatives in the areas of Access, Service Coordination, Youth and Family/Caregiver Engagement and Mental Health and Wellbeing."

#### Foundation supports Hospital with \$1.85 Million in Grants

From 2018 through to 2020, the Foundation has committed \$1.85 M to purchase much needed equipment and to fund renovations.

The Foundation contributed \$750,000 to build new Clinics, \$100,000 for a Family Room and \$196,000 towards equipment including \$160,000 for a new x ray machine.

The Foundation has also committed another \$250,000 towards the clinic and \$275,000 to purchase a new Ultrasound. Other projects currently on the go funded by the Foundation include a major renovation project to upgrade the space in the Long Term Care Unit.


#### Generous Bequest to purchase new Ultrasound
